

High Grass and Weeds

Yard maintenance throughout
Franklin County is crucial in the
warmer months- when grass and
weeds can quickly grow out of
control and lead to an infestation
by rodents or other vermin. This
overgrowth can create a blighted
appearance in our neighborhoods
and endanger public health and
safety.

In most communities high grass and noxious weeds are considered nuisances not only because they provide harborage and breeding grounds for pests but they can otherwise create health hazards. Some weeds and wild plants are

capable of causing skin and allergic reactions; producing or aggravating hay fever, asthma, or similar respiratory health conditions.

Each community defines what "High Grass" and prohibited plants may include. In the City of Columbus, grass should not be over 12 inches in height.



→ Burdock

→ Mullein

→ Thistles

→ Poison Ivy

→ Jimson Weed

Poison Oak

Ragweed

→ Poison Sumac

→ Milkweed

→ Pokeberry

If someone in your Columbus neighborhood refuses to cut their lawn, infractions of these codes may be reported to the City by calling (614)-645-3111.

In many of our Franklin County
Communities- weed and grass cutting may
be performed by city staff and/or
contractors with the abatement costs being
billed to the owner if not timely remedied.
